Comprehensive dog training sessions for agility, designed with a train-thetrainer approach. This workshop will give you the instruction and tools you need to facilitate your own county level dog training program. Participants can attend this training with or without their own dog. Participating dogs must have training in basic obedience. Beginner agility work will be on-leash. All volunteer trainers and youth members are encouraged to attend.



Kim has had a lifetime love of dogs that started in 4-H when she was eight years old. She started training her instructor's Sheltie, Sprite in the dog program. She received her own Sheltie, Max a year later and showed him in Obedience and Junior Showmanship in various 4-H competitions as well as in the American Kennel Club (AKC) junior handler program. She also trained and showed her other Shelties, Abby and Sadie until she left for college. After finishing college and picking up a second job at a Vet Clinic part-time her next Sheltie, Jack found her. Having been absent from the dog world, Kim started to take basic obedience classes and beginner's agility to help build Jack's confidence. She still teaches a foundation of obedience to her dogs, but once she was bitten by the agility bug her focus shifted to agility.

Kim has been competing in agility for over 10 years. She has achieved nine Master Agility Championship titles with three dogs and has been an AKC National Finalist multiple times with her Sheltie, Racket. Kim and Racket did not start competing internationally until 2013. In 2013, they won a spot on the European Open team and traveled to Belgium. In 2014, Racket and Kim won a spot on the European Open team traveling to Hungary and made it to finals in both individual and team events. Also in 2014, they earned a spot on the FCI AKC World Team that traveled to Luxembourg. In 2015, Kim and Racket competed in the Europe Open located in Germany and Racket was named the alternate for small dogs for the FCI AKC World Team. Kim works full time as a paralegal and resides with her husband and four Shelties in Weston, Wisconsin.
